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Extensive genealogical interest is shown in our State by three publications the Editor has recently received:

The Columbia Statesman, Columbia, Kentucky, publishes a Genealogy column, containing queries and answers, edited by Ruth Paul Burdette, a nationally recognized authority in the field.

Mrs. Lula Reed Boss sent a copy of the Lewis County Herald, Vanceburg, Kentucky, in which is published the column "Ancestor Hunting" by Dr. W. M. Talley, of that city. Dr. Talley, long interested in the subject, will continue to conduct the column while at McDonald College of McGill University, Quebec, Canada, where he is professor of psychology.

Cardinal "Ancestral" Notes, July 1969 issue, contains notations of land grants, abstracts of pensions, marriage records, letters held in the Post Office in 1829 and other helpful data for those seeking information regarding Henderson County families. The magazine is edited by Katheryn Howe Baskett, Henderson, Kentucky.

and Amanda Louise Wood. Wife: Elizabeth January, "the  
daughter of Mr. John Marshall of Woodford county, Kentucky."

Samuel January married in Woodford County, Kentucky,  
December 29, 1795, Elizabeth (Betsy) Marshall.

Of the children of Samuel January:

1. Peter T. January - living in 1859.
2. John M. January - living in 1859.
3. Clementina E. January - married (1) in Mason County  
(as his second wife) 2-17-1825, Henry Machir, born  
about 1777; died in Maysville, Mason County,  
7-17-1828. Mrs. Clementina E. Machir married (2)  
Major William K. Wall, 3-8-1836. They were living  
in Harrison County, Kentucky, in 1870, and had  
issue: William Samuel Wall, James Garrett Wall  
and Richard Meniffee Wall.
4. Eliza Ann January - married in Mason County on  
7-2-1822, Buckner H. Payne; she married (2) John

Morrow. In 1870 they were residents of Union County, Kentucky.

5. Mary Jane January - married in Mason County on 9-25-1833, George F. Catlett. She was deceased by 1859 and left issue: Elizabeth, Robert, George and Albert Catlett. In 1870 the Catletts were living in Union County, Kentucky.
6. Frances M. January - married (1) in Mason County on 4-14-1830, George M. Wall; married (2) ----- Clarke. In 1870 they were residents of Union County, Kentucky.
7. Samuel F. January - living in 1859.
8. James B. P. January - living in 1859.
9. Amanda Louise January - deceased by 1859 - married in Mason County on 11-9-1831, William Wood.

10. Pamela January - died before her father - married in Mason County on 1-15-1814, Samuel A. January.

Samuel January was the son of Peter January, born 1725 in Pennsylvania, son of the immigrant, Thomas Janvier, son of Pierre Janvier, the French Huguenot, who had to be buried privately in the cellar of his home on the Ile of Rhe because of the prohibition of Protestant Christian burials.

#### FAYETTE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Will of Peter January of Fayette County, State of Virginia (later Kentucky)

Dated February 26, 1787      Proven July Court, 1789

"Aged and infirm" - mentions sons Samuel and John January; son-in-law, William McConnell. If either of two sons die before the age of 21 years, or marry, then bequest to surviving son. Wife Deborah January. Sons: James, Ephraim, Samuel and John January; daughter Sarah "if she should move into the District of Kentucky."

Sons, James and Ephraim January, executors. Witnesses: Caleb Wallace, James C. Frisco, Samuel Walker and Michael Kirkham. (From Kentucky Court & Other Records, by Mrs. William B. Ardery of Paris, Kentucky, Volume 2 - page 97).

Peter January married in Pennsylvania in 1753, Deborah McMichan, who survived him. They removed to Kentucky in 1780.

Listed among the first lot holders in Lexington, Fayette County, District of Kentucky, State of Virginia, December 26, 1781, are:

Peter, James and Ephraim January. In 1783, Samuel January appears as a lot holder. (Collin's History of Kentucky - page 172).

John January married Susan McFarland (or McFarling), December 2, 1789.

Samuel January married Betsy Marshall, December 29, 1795.

Regiment; men mostly recruited in District of Kentucky.

Will of Ephraim January of the County of Jessamine  
and State of Kentucky.

Dated: July 11, 1823 Proven: August Court, 1823

All just debts to be paid. Requests daughter Hannah  
Young to occupy the premises on which she now lives if he  
thinks proper until wife's death. Son Peter January to  
have the privilege of living on the lot on which he has  
begun a tanyard until wife's death should he think proper  
and at the division of the estate after wife's death  
the profit of fixing this shall be his own. Daughter  
Nancy Cates (?) to have one horse and one cow. To beloved  
wife Sarrah the balance of the land on "which I now live,  
with house and other improvements, household and kitchen  
furniture and as much of the stock and other property as  
she may think proper to keep for her support during her  
life." At death of wife Sarrah all land and other property  
shall be equally divided amongst all children: Mary  
Wilson, Hannah Young, Martha Heagen, Ann Young, Sarrah  
Bell, Peter January, Andrew January, Ephraim January,  
Robert January and Nancy Cates (?) Wife Sarrah  
January, Moses Wilson and Peter January, executors.  
Witnesses: Tilgham W. Bell, Lewis W. Lamkin and  
John McGuire.

Ephriam January was born in 1759 in Pennsylvania -



married in Pennsylvania, Sarah McConnell (1763-1850), daughter of Andrew McConnell who was killed at the Battle of Blue Licks, August 19, 1782. His name is on the Memorial Monument at Blue Licks State Park.

Andrew McConnell January, son of Ephraim January, was born in Jessamine County, Kentucky, Aug. 3, 1794 and died in Maysville, Mason County, Kentucky, June 11, 1877. He married in Fayette County, Kentucky, Dec. 31, 1816, Sarah Huston (1799-1867), daughter of William Huston (1766-1838) of Lexington, Kentucky, and his wife, Elizabeth Braxton (1769-1833). Andrew McConnell January and wife had 13 children; only two survived their parents. His will is recorded in Will Book X - page 91 - Mason County Court.

A chapter concerning the Civil War experiences of John Wesley Neal and the 84th Regiment Illinois Volunteer Infantry follows.

Thirteen children were born to John Wesley and Nancy (Howell) Neal. Part II is made up of thirteen chapters, each treating of one of these children and their children and grandchildren. Colorful biographies of the descendants add zest to the reading of genealogical data such as birth, marriage and death dates.

The Neal Family Tree is given in chart form at the beginning of Part III which traces the ancestors of John Wesley Neal briefly but adequately.
