ORIGIN OF THE NAME GILTNER.

The root: Gald, Gild, Geld, Gilt, Gilling, Giltner, Gothic name, Gildia, Gildemir, Giltmir, Giltmir, Giltmir.

Icelandic; Gild, money, Gildi, tribute.

Danish; Gild, money to pay tax, Gild, full of worth.

Swedish; Gild, full of worth.

Norse; Gild, full of worth.

German; Gild, society, corporation or company. The first gild was instituted by King Olaf of Norway, A.D. 1066.

Gilte-mir, Giltmir, Gildmer, was no doubt one of the same surname of a family of old Gothe and originally was Gildo or Gildia. The head of this family by some means rendered himself illustrious and had the suffix "mir" which means "illustrious", "famous" added, thus "Gildia-mir"; dropping the vowel "a" leaves Gildmir or Giltmir and Giltmir. The name underwent another modification Geldner, Gildner, Gildener. This latter change came about when the dental sound "d" was substituted for "t" and "n" for "m". Giltmir has the claim of being the original orthography and expresses its true significance "famous". Giltmir, Giltmir, a mythological name of the golden hall in heaven. "Mir" or "mer", Gothic word meaning "famous". Gildmir is, therefore, Gildo, the illustrious. The name spelled variously "Giltner" or "Gildener" has been anglicized to GILTNER.

Genealogy of the GILTNER FAMILY.

GILTNER FROM SWEDEN.

In the year 1634 a vessel from Sweden landed at Charleston, South Carolina. Two brothers, Giltner, by name, embarked therefrom, one of these dying on the voyage. The survivor landed and settled at Charleston and aided in the erection of the first Lutheran Church in that City.

These two brothers had been officers in the army of the good Protestant Gustavus Adolphus. In the battle of Lutzen 1632 their leader was slain and they with others fled to America to escape persecution. The surviving brother (who settled at Charleston) had one son. He being a Swede and most of the members of the congregation being German, he sent this son to Heidelberg Germany to be educated for the ministry at the University.

This son having finished his course at the University, married in Heidelberg and never returned to America. He had a son-- or grandson -- John Francis. There is a well authenticated family tradition that this JOHN FRANCIS and two of his brothers were in the body guard of Fredrick the Great. They were said to be splendid specimens of manhood, being about six feet, four inches in height.

JOHN FRANCIS GILTNER having married CATHERINE WEBER, daughter of JOHN WOLFFORT WEBER of Amsterdam, Holland sailed from Rotterdam, Holland on the GLASCOW, Walter Sterling, Master. On the passenger list his name is recorded FRANZ GILTNER but in the old family Bible his name is recorded JOHANNES FRANCISCUS GILTNER. The ship Glasgow landed at Philadelphia, September 9th, 1738 and John Francis Giltner settled on a farm one and one-fourth miles South-east from Sacquerville, Heidelberg, Township, Lehigh (or Berkshire) County, Penn. This land was purchased from the heirs of William Penn.

CATHERINE WEBER so incurred the displeasure of her father, John Wolffort Weber, in marrying John Francis Giltner (because of his being a soldier)

that he made a will so entailing his extensive property that the same should not be distributed until the fifth generation of their descendants. The Compiler of this record has personally seen a copy of this will (in German) sent to him by one Humphries, a lawyer, from Amsterdam. This Will is probably still in the writer's possession, but has been temporarily mislaid.

There is a story (of doubtful authenticity) copied from an old record owned by Fannie Giltner Russell of Pleasant Hill, Mo., to the effect that this same John Wolfort Weber came to America and after being in this country several years, sent for his family, consisting of wife, one daughter, and three sons. When the vessel landed at the wharf in Philadelphia the wife recognizing her husband in the dense fog and throng shrieked, "Here are your children. I have taken care of them these long years. Now you must take care of them." And then dropped dead.

Another authority furnishes the following data: "John Francis Giltner married Catherine Weber, May 29th, 1748. Catherein Weber was born May 28th, 1725. Her father Wolfort Weber was born in Germany and came to America when a young man. He is reported to have been a man of wealth; and landing first on Manhattan Island, purchased 103 acres in what is now the centre of New York City. Wolfort Weber was married in the old Swede Church at Wilmington, Delaware to Miss Aneke _____ (last name unknown). He was buried in the Heidelberg Cemetery, Lehigh County, Penn."

Other authorities agree that John Wolfort Weber was a brother of Anneke Jans and one of the wealthy Hollanders whose estate in New Amsterdam (now New York) were confiscated by the British after their last conquest of the place in 1674. It is said that John Wolfort Weber, father of Catherine Weber, John Francis Giltner and his wife, Catherein Weber Giltner were buried side by side in the old Heidelberg Cemetery at Heidelberg, Penn. It is stated that John Francis Giltner was his wife's fourteenth husband. ^{Catherein} Catherein Weber after her husband's death, lived to the

age of eighty-four at the home of her son, Andrew, who purchased his father's farm.

John Francis Giltner and his wife, Catherine, were blessed a large family of children. Authorities agree as to the names of their sons, but different chroniclers give a different number of daughters and are at variance as to their names.

The Penn. War records show that Bernhart (Bernard), Andrew, Christian, Conrad, Franz, and Tobias Giltner, all served in the Revolutionary War.

Most of the authorities do not give Rachel and Anne Marie. Others omit Albertina. They differ as to the order of the daughters. They mostly agree that there were at least four daughters.

BERNARD GILTNER.

Bernard Giltner, the eldest son of JOHN FRANCIS GILTNER, married Catherine Margaret Lichtenwalter, daughter of Abram Lichtenwalter. Moved from Pennsylvania to Kentucky in 1787, settling on a farm he purchased in Bourbon County. He came down the Ohio River in a flat boat and landed at Maysville. His was the first family to settle outside of Bryant's Station.

But as those first given were copied from the Lutheran Church records at Heidelberg, Lehigh County, Penn., they are probably more accurate. The sons of Bernard Giltner settled in Fayette, Franklin, and Bourbon Counties, Ky. and became the heads of prosperous families. The annals of the Giltners of Kentucky disclose the fact that when a young man, John C. Breckenridge, afterwards the U. S. Senator, was a suitor for the hand of the grand-daughter of BERNARD GILTNER: and that the grand-son of Francis Giltner married a daughter-in-law of the Hon. Robert Wickliff of Kentucky.

Andrew Giltner died of hemorrhage of the lungs June 20, 1810, at the old homestead, Heidelberg Township, Lehigh County, Penn. This was the homestead and house of his father, JOHN FRANCIS GILTNER. The original house (built by the latter) of square hewn logs was standing until 1875 when it was pulled down. This property was sold at auction after the death of Andrew Giltner and was bought in 1811 by a man by the name of Joseph Hunsicker. The tract originally contained 183 acres.

The above was copied and translated from the old German Bible brought to America by the Giltner ancestors. This Bible is bound in oak boards 1/4 of an inch in thickness, covered with leather and secured by massive copper clasps. It is now in the possession of Frank Lichtler of Piqua, Ohio.

FRANCIS GILTNER, founder of the Hunter's Bottom branch of the GILTNER family was married to Elizabeth Boyer, daughter of a pioneer who emigrated from Hagerstown, Md. to Kentucky about 1792. Francis Giltner was a prosperous farmer of Bourbon County. Wishing to enlarge his acreage of land, he sold his farm in Bourbon County and moved to Gallatin County in the year 1818. (Carroll County was formerly a part of Gallatin County) where he purchased a large tract of land and from time to time added to his former purchase in Hunter's Bottom several farms. At the time of his death in 1849, he bequeathed to his children not only valuable land, but money and securities to an amount which at that time was a considerable fortune.

Alexander Martin Giltner purchased in 1850 the Monroe County, Iowa land on which he resided from 1856 till his death in May 1891. He returned to Indiana in 1851 and shortly left overland for the gold fields of California in the Spring of 1852. He remained in California until 1855. Alexander Giltner and all of his family were of large stature. He himself stood over six feet and weighed 235 lbs. He was elected to the Iowa State Legislature in 1875. He brought to his country the first pedigree short horn cattle. His children are intelligent, cultured people and his son, William Edward has been most successful in his practice as an attorney.

It may be mentioned that Catherine Leiter who married Abram Giltner and the other Leiters who intermarried with the Giltner

family are closely related to the Chicago Leiters. Joseph Leiter of the great wheat deal; Lady Curson of the Vice roy of India and Miss Daisy Leiter who married a member of the English Nobility are possibly great nephews and nieces of Catherine Leiter.
