

A Carroll County child died Friday morning at a Louisville hospital following an accidental shooting in Prestonville Thursday morning.

Salina Burchfield, 6, of Route 1, Carrollton was left with her two brothers, ages 8 and 10, in their grandfather's truck. Gobel Moore, the grandfather, was running late in taking the children to school. He stopped in Prestonville at P.J.'s Crafts to deliver items for the store, owned by relatives.

While he was in the store, Salina was accidentally shot in the head by a .22 caliber pistol she found under the seat of the truck.

According to reports by Deputy Sheriff Charles Maiden, (Salina) found the gun under the seat; one of the brothers took the gun away from her and began playing with it.

The shooting was reported to the county's emergency service dispatch at 9:16 a.m. Maiden and two EMT's, Ed Hill and Don Becker, both Carroll County Memorial Hospital employees, were in the area and responded to the call and were on the scene three minutes later.

"I have a pulse," Maiden called back over the radio to the hospital. Rather than wait for the ambulance, Becker cared for Salina as Maiden drove her to the hospital in his squad car. The Ambulance Service had been dispatched to the scene; however, the first unit was working on another call.

Carrollton Police Chief Laman Stark cleared traffic and escorted Maiden through town to the hospital where she was treated until Statflight arrived at approximately 10:05 to take her to Kosair Children's Hospital in Louisville where she died at 10:53 a.m. the next day.

According to Maiden, the gun had been under the seat for quite sometime. The handgun, a nineshot revolver made by Ivers and Please see CHILD page 22
