Mr. and Mrs. Victor Planeaux of Carrollton; and a son-in-law, Patrick Ballard of Winchester.

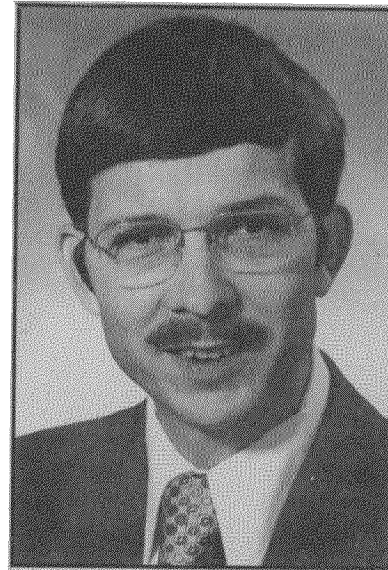

Westrick dies, was judge for four terms

On Monday morning, St. John Catholic Church was filled with family, friends, loved ones and political acquaintances of Robert M. Westrick.

Following the service the group gathered around his grave next to his wife's grave.

The former judge/executive died at his home on Buffalo Road near Worthville Thursday evening, May 2, of congestive heart failure.

Westrick was known as "the judge" simply because he'd had that title for the most number of years in Carroll County's history.

Serving four terms as the county's leader, Westrick did not seek re-election in 1989. His failing health complicated by a diabetic condition had left him tired and ready for retirement.

At age 62, Westrick had fought many personal as well as professional battles.

Commonwealth Attorney James Crawford, a lecturer at St. John, highlighted Westrick's life in a reading during the funeral Monday.

Crawford said Westrick had had many problems to overcome in his life.

"He married his beloved wife, Sharon Hudgins of Wheatley on Jan. 8, 1949. Of their marriage, 3 children were born: Bobby Lee, Monica and Logan Jeffery.

"In December of 1970, his wife Sharon died unexpectedly and he raised his children alone, never remarrying. His youngest son, Logan Jefferey died tragically in an industrial accident in May of

"He supported his family as a factory worker at the Carrollton Furniture until he was elected Carroll County sheriff and took office on Jan. 1, 1970."

Westrick served his term as sheriff before being elected judge, a title he kept for 16 years until Jan. 1, 1990.

During his tenure, the courthouse and hospital were renovated, the public library was built, the senior citizens center was built on Sixth Street, the county park was built, and the ambulance service was housed in a garage near the hospital.

Carroll County Water District No. 1 was expanded and new

industries came to the county.

However, Judge/Executive Harold "Shorty" Tomlinson said Westrick told him he was most proud of helping the poor people of the county.

Crawford said, "He was dedicated to the people of this community. He was a unique person—a unique leader. In a time in which the American people often feel betrayed by their elected officials at all levels, Judge Westrick was a different type of leader.

"Strong and opinionated, he would listen to both sides of an issue, and then tell you what he

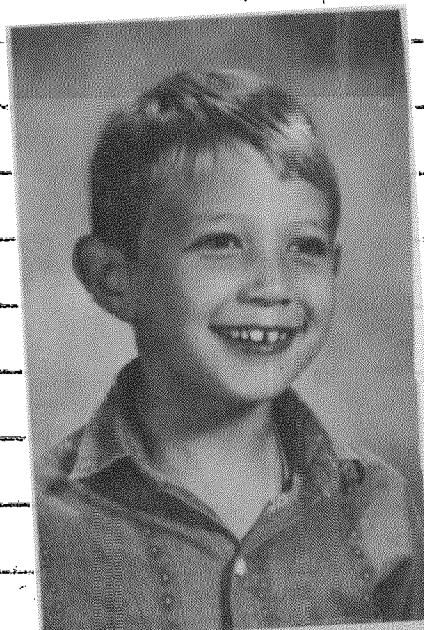

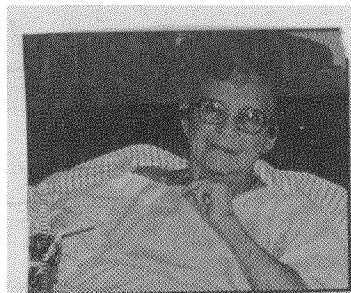
