

THE JORDAN FAMILY OF LAWRENCE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

THEIR VIRGINIA ORIGIN

Most of the Jordans who settled in that part of Floyd County, Kentucky, which would become Lawrence County, originated from Bedford County, Virginia. They first moved to Russell County, Virginia, and then to Kentucky.

Two Jordan families lived in Bedford County during the period of 1775 through 1810. The first family to arrive there was the family of Jonas Jordan, Sr., and his sons, Absolom, Benjamin and Jonas, Jr. The second family to appear was the family of William Jordan 1 .

Jonas Jordan, Sr., died about 1785 and his son Absolom, was named as his heir-at-law. Jonas, Jr. owned land in Bedford County through 1788, at which time he sold his land to his brother, Absolom, and moved south into the Carolinas where he is shown in the census of 1810. Benjamin Jordan sold his land to Absolom at about the same time; however in 1793, he repurchased 200 acres of land in Bedford County. We have no further record of Benjamin and do not know what happened to him. Absolom continued living in Bedford County until his death in 1826. His will named the following children: John Jordan, Vincent Jordan, Rosanah Dickenson, deceased (wife of William Dickenson), Ony Jordan, Lucy Noble, William Jordan, Leroy Jordan, Sashwell Jordan and a grandson, Hezekiah Dickenson, son of his deceased daughter, Rosanah Dickenson.

On 15 June 1870, in Bedford County, Va., William Jordan married Lucy Stith, daughter of Richard Stith. Richard Stith owned land in both Bedford and Campbell Counties, after the erection of Campbell County in 1782. Records concerning William following his marriage to Lucy are found in both of these counties. It is believed that he lived on land (located in Bedford County) which belonged to Richard Stith, as William was not a taxpayer in Bedford County. Campbell County records show that William was living in Bedford County in 1794 but that he owned land in Campbell County. "William Jordan, of Bedford County -- 600 acres on Little Falling River" (Deed Book 3, p. 531). William's son by a previous marriage, Woodson Jordan, owned land in Campbell County in 1796 (Deed Book 3, p. 627).

No relationship between these two Jordan families has been established to date, but it is our belief that they were related in some way. The 1810 Bedford Co., Va. census shows Absolom and his sons, Leroy, Vincent, Sashwell, and Jeremiah. It also shows Woodson, Hiram, Covey and William² Jordan. We have always believed that the four latter individuals were the sons of William Jordan¹, but only one of these men was shown in the will of William¹ which is in Breckinridge Co., Ky., under the date of 1817. That individual was Woodson Jordan.

Sometime between 1804 and 1810, William Jordan¹ and a son, Samuel, left Bedford County. Samuel moved to Breckinridge Co., Ky., where he is shown in the 1810 census. William Jordan¹ is not shown in Breckinridge County in 1810. One William Jordanis; however, the only Jordan shown in the 1810 Russell Co., Va. Tax List.

In 1820, Covey and William $Jordan^2$ were in Russell Co., Va., Hiram (with Jonas

and Jesse) was in Floyd County (later Lawrence Co.), Kentucky, and Woodson Jordan was in Breckinridge Co., Ky., with Samuel Jordan.

Hiram, Covey and William² each spent some part of their lives in Lawrence Co., Ky. They appear to have had a life-long association. William² was in Lawrence Co. by 1826, at which time he purchased land from Hiram. After selling his land in 1826, Hiram moved to Edmonson Co., Ky., which is near Breckinridge County, where other Jordan and Stith families lived. He returned to Lawrence County briefly in the mid-1850's and remarried. This marriage record (together with the 1810 census of Bedford Co., Va., which shows his age as between 18-26) establishes his birth year as ca 1792 in Bedford Co., Va. Covey first appeared in Lawrence Co. in the 1850 census. He also married again in Lawrence Co. in 1854, verifying that he was born ca 1784 in Bedford Co., Va.

For many years we searched for the marriage records of Hiram and Covey, whom we knew were married before leaving Bedford Co., Va. A research trip to Bedford led to the discovery that the marriage bond for Covey Jordan is listed under the name Jacobus Jordan. The letter of consent written by Juda Carter, mother of the bride, gives permission for the marriage of her daughter, Patsy Carter to COVOUS JURDEN, confirming that Covey and Jacob are the same person. We have a photo copy of this consent form. The marriage was 15 March 1803, in Bedford Co., Va.

There is also a marriage record in Bedford County for a James Jordan to Elizabeth H. Overstreet on 29 February 1808. The consent form for this bond indicates that James had a middle initial (not shown on the face of the bond), but it has become illegible. Since the names James and Hiram were later paired together in this family, it may be that this is actually Hiram's marriage record, but there is no conclusive proof in this instance.

Although members of the Jordan family continued to live in Russell Co., Va., for many years, no Jordan wills, deeds or marriage records have survived. We believe it will prove very difficult (if not impossible) to document many of the events that occurred there before 1850.

Several Jordans lived in Eastern Kentucky whose relationship to the Jordan family has not been established.

- 1. Pleasant Jordan, b. in Va. between 1790-1800. He married Anna Burchett in Lawrence Co., Ohio, in 1821 but lived in Lawrence Co., Ky. in 1830. He purchased land in Lawrence Co., Ky. in 1826 from Hiram Jordan but his widow lived in Carter Co., Ky. in 1850. Their whereabouts in 1840 is unknown. Although our own family is directly descended from this man, we have been unable to find sufficient records to positively identify his place in the Jordan family.
- 2. Richard Jordan, b. ca 1802 in Va. He married Millia Derifield, daughter of Enos Derifield, and lived in Lawrence Co., Ky.
- 3. Absolom Jordan, b. 1790-1800 in Va., shown in 1840 Carter Co., Ky. census.
- 4. Absolom Jordan, b 1810-1820 in Va., shown in 1840 Lawrence Co., Ky. census.

- 5. Anna (Jordan) Skeens, b. ca 1818 in Va. She married (date unknown) William Skeens and lived in Lawrence Co., Ky.
- 6. Eleanor Jordan, b. ca 1815 in Va. and is shown in the 1850, 1860, & 1870 Lawrence Co., Ky. censuses.

We have not researched the family of James and Martha Jordan from North Carolina who settled in the Carter County, Ky. area.

We are now in the planning stage of a book detailing known Jordan families and the many records we have collected over a period of some more than 30 years. We would welcome correspondence from anyone who can add to our knowledge of this family and anyone willing to share with us their descent from one of the Jordan Pioneer Families who settled in Eastern Kentucky.

I have followed with interest the story of the Littles by Mr. Julian Little in recent issues of TEK. I was especially interested in the part where the Littles have intermarried with the Branhams.

I have had many letters from people interested in the ancestry of the Branhams of Floyd County. One question we would all like to have answered is: "Who is David Branham's wife?". We refer to the David Branham who remained in Floyd County.


My grandfather was King Solomon Akers, son of Daniel and Artie Akers. Artie was the daughter of Amos and Sarah (Sally) Branham Justice. Amos and Sarah were married Nov. $25 \, \text{th}$, 1822^1 .

Sarah (Sally) was the daughter of William and Gracie Branham². Tradition is that William is the son of David Branham and wife, Susan Burbridge Branham.

Someone sent me a very authenic looking document showing Susan Burbridge married David Branham of Virginia. At the top of the page it shows that this was from "Kentucky Pioneer and Court Records", compiled by Mrs. Henry Kennett McAdams, published by Genealogical Publishing Company, 1967. Preceding names of children of the Burbridges was this: "Bible Records and Burbridge History". This was uncertified by Mrs. Mary L. Burbridge Austin, Lexington, Ky.

Mrs. Austin states: My g-g-grandfather came from England, settled in Spotsylvania County, Va., near the Potomac River. His wife was Sally Sharp. Their children were:

- 1. Millie m. a Mr. Robinson.
- 2. Sally m. Mr. Elley -- lived Scott Co., Ky.
- 3. Money m. Wm. Bullit.
- 4. Mary m. Mr. Ellis.
- 5. Betsy m. Garner Branham.
- 6. Mary m. Mr. Ellis.
- 7. Susan m. David Branham of Virginia.
- 8. Linfield Burbridge.
- 9. Thomas, lived Springfield, Ky.

10. Fanny m. Robert Smith.

However, Ardery's "KENTUCKY RECORDS", published by Genealogical Publishing Company in the section of Scott Co. wills, shows the will of Thomas Burbridge, Jr. as follows:

"Thomas Burbridge---' All my brothers and sisters: Viz; Lunsford (Linfield), George, Mildred Robinson, Sarah Elley, Frances Smith, Elizabeth Branham, Mary Bullet, Executors: Brothes: Lunsfield, George and brother-in-laws: Henry Elley, Robert Smith, Benjamin Robinson, Tavener Branham. dated 9-27-1794 and will proven 1-179?. Witnesses: Ed Elley, Matthew Gale, Sr.; William Wood, Thomas and Henry Elley.

Note that Thomas Burbridge, Jr. does not name a sister, Susan. Note also that the Branham brother-in-law is not GARNER, but TAVNER. This is understandable, considering the writing in the day in which the will was written. Some documents were copies from old English and Tavner could easily have been mistaken for Garner. However, Garner is not seen anywhere else, but Tavner is seen many times.

Wanting to prove further that this family did or did not have a Susan, I wrote to Spotsylvania Co., Va. for the will of the Senior Thomas Burbridge. It too showed no Susan⁴. In this document Thomas Burbridge, Sr.'s children were shown as follows:

My son, Thomas Burbridge; daughter, Mildred Robinson; daughter Sarah Elley; daughter Frances Smith; daughter, Elizabeth Branham; son, Linsfield Burbridge; daughter, Mary Bullet; son, George Burbridge; grandson, Thomas Burbridge; son, Robert Burbridge, deceased; all remaining to be divided between my eight children⁵. (He names them all again as shown above.)

I noted the apology of Dorothy Baisden in the Autumn edition of SANDY VALLEY HERITAGE (quarterly of the Big Sandy Valley Historical Society) and to Dorothy I say no apology needed, for you still may be right about David Branham being the husband of Susan Burbridge. You see, when Mrs. Austin said that her ancestor, Thomas Burbridge, came from England she was probably right, but it does no seem to the Thomas who made his will in 1791.

The Burbridge family did come to Kentucky from Spotsylvania. From THEY WENT THAT A WAY, page 73, date of 6-13-1792:

"Thomas Burbridge, Benjamin Robinson, Henry Ealey and Tavener Branham (All of state of Ky.) give power of attorney to friends: Robert Smith, Linfield Burbridge and George Burbridge, to sell a tract of land in Spotsylvania Co., Va., part of which is claimed by parties of the first part as legaties of Thomas Burbridge dec. Wit.: Matthew Bridges, Richard Branham, and Wm. Parker. 9-4-1792"

To show that a Thomas Burbridge did come into the country at a very early date we have the following: from Patent Book 1 of Virginia Records as shown in CAVALIERS and PIONEERS, by Nell Marion Nugent, May 7th, 1638, page 573: Upon

the East side of mouth of Nansamund River due for transporting 12 persons, Thomas Burbridge and 11 others".

So it looks as if the pioneer of the Burbridge family came to this country in 1638.

There could have been several Thomas Burbridges between 1638 and 1790 (52 years) and one of these Thomases COULD HAVE HAD A SUSAN WHO MARRIED DAVID BRANHAM.

TWO DAVID BRANHAMS:

To complicate things further, there were TWO David Branhams in Floyd County, beginning about 1803 or so. One married Elizabeth Little as shown in records of Julius Little and settled on Caney Creek in Floyd Co., (Later to be Pike Co.). One settled on Mud Creek and his descendants continued to live in Floyd County even after Pike Co. was formed.

We know very little about the one who settled in what is now Floyd County (and is supposed to have had wife, Susan), except that he had a son, William, who was the administrator of his estate when he died in 1825^6 . Wells "ANNALS" shows a David Branham bought of David Morgan 40 acres on Mud Creek for \$40.00 March 9, 1812. We think this is our ancestor as it is not likely that the David who settled on Caney would have been buying land on Mud Creek.

There are many references in ANNALS OF FLOYD COUNTY by Charles C. Wells and I think most of them refer to David Branham of Caney Creek (Pike Co.), except the two mentioned above. The Pike Co. David seemed to be a more active and a younger man than Floyd Co.'s David, father of William. The Pike Co. David died in 1849, according to family records, 7 years after the Floyd Co. David died in 1825.

Montgomery Co., Va. records show there was a David Branham there before 1800 and we believe it was the David who later moved to Floyd County, Ky. See below.

Jean Smith Baisden married Rhoda Branham, daughter of David Oct 4th, 1795: (From WILLS AND MARRIAGES OF MONTGOMERY CO. & FINCASTLE CO. 1733-1831).

Turner Branham married Mary Nick March 16, 1795, son of David (from same source).

Since Pike Co. David Branham did not have either a Turner or a Rhoda, these could have been the children of the David Branham who later moved to Floyd County.

A David Branham was a member of the Loyal Land Company. (From AUGUSTA HISTORICAL BULLETIN, published by Augusta Historical Society V. 6, Fall of 1970.)

Both David Branham and his son-in-law, Jean S. Baisden are listed with property in Montgomery Co., Va. around 1790.

William Branham, son of David, moved from Floyd Co. in 1830 to Indiana. From Margaret Bell of 761 Mueller Road, O'Fallon, Mo., we have this record:

BRANHAMS

"William Branham is buried in Cloverdale Cemetery in Putnam Co., Ind., and the gravestone shows that he was born 3-22-1771 and died 7-6-1847. His will shows that he was the husband of Gracie and Sara Justice (Sally) was mentioned as an heir."

NOTES: Mrs. Justice listed notes as footnotes, which did not work out for our listing. Thus the break in these in this article.

SUPPLEMENT TO THE ABOVE:

As Vice-President for KY of the Big Sandy Valley Historical Society, this editor is going to lift the full text of Mrs. Baisden's letter to Mr. James Moore, Treas of the Society as it appeared in the Fall issue of SANDY VALLEY HERITAGE.

"Dear Mr. Moore,

I recently sent my intent to publish, "THE HISTORY OF THE BAISDEN FAMILY AND ALLIED FAMILIES", in particular that of John Smith Baisden.

Since my correspondence with you, I have discovered that David Branham Sr.'s wife was not Susan Burbridge, daughter of Thomas Burbridge.

David Branham, Sr. went into Floyd County, Kentucky about 1793 and was active in the developing of the "Mud Creek" section of that county, as well as being active in politics.

David Branham, Sr. was born in Ireland, the son of John Branham. He married Frances Baskett in Ireland and they were married about 1756. By 1860 they were housekeeping in Goochland County, Virginia. David Sr. is listed on the tax records of Montgomery County, Virginia as of the 28 July 1786 as owning 221 acres on Greasy Creek. On the 19 November 1789, he is listed as owning 179 acres on the South Side of Little River, about ½ mile above Big Falls. In 1797 he witnessed the sale of 200 acres of land in Montgomery County, Va., from Augustus Godsey of Montgomery County, Va. and John Smith Baisden of Wythe County, Va. Source: Copy of the land transaction "Godsey to Baisden".

"Isaac Little and his Descendants" by Julius Little, 108 Saxon Drive, McMurray, Pennsylvania, 15317. (Isaac Little's daughter, Elizabeth, married David Branham, Jr., son of David, Sr.). (Ed. Note: Earlier portion of Isaac Little and his Descendants published in June, Sept & Dec 85 issues of TEK.)

Sorry about the error, but none of us are perfect, we think we have them cornered and they slip away. /s/ Respectively, Dorothy Baisden, 3012 Pinewood Ave., Bellingham, Wash 98225."



WILLIAM GREEN WELLS

A "Kentucky Confederate Soldier

By

This is the conclusion of a 2-part article continued from the December 1985 Issue.

In April 1863, William Wells sent his 14 year old son, M. L. K., off to join the the 10th Kentucky Confederate Mounted Rifles. ²⁶However his stay with the 10th was short. By Summer of 1863, he had transferred to Capt. Samuel W. Thompson's Company of Patton's Battalion of Kentucky Partisan Rangers. The only surviving roster of Thompson's Company lists M. L. K. Wells, "Daves Meeks", plus three sons of Doctor Wells". Although not identified, the "three sons" were probably Richard M., William A. C., and Aaron Wells, son of Doctor William Green Wells. The only other son of William Wells who was old enough to have served, Moses Wells, was living away from the family at the time in question. ²⁸

Patton's Rangers was formed in the Summer of 1863 by Lt. Col. Oliver Patton, a Covington attorney. He was commissioned by the Confederate government to raise a battalion of partisan rangers in Morgan, Johnson, and surrounding counties. The term "partisan rangers" was used to designate Confederate units which operated behind enemy lines in order to disrupt normal military and civilian operations and, therefore, detain a disproportinate number of Union soldiers from service on the front lines. Patton's men carried out several raids but, when Col. Patton was captured in West Liberty in August 1863, the battalion was disbanded. Captain Thompson and several members of his company immediately affiliated with the 13th Kentucky Cavalry, C. S. A., while the other two companies, commanded by the notorious Cook brothers, became Company G of the 7th Confederate Cavalry.

Aaron, William A., and Richard M. Wells chose not to enlist in another unit and returned to their homes. M. L. K. Wells became disenchanted with the Confederate service and on September 10, 1863, joined the 45th Kentucky Mounted Infantry, of the Union Army. His father and other members of his family were strongly opposed". Emily tradition has it that William Green Wells avoided contact with his "Yankee" son for at least two years after the War and refused to M. L. K.'s wedding in 1867.

During the last years of the War, Johnson County was plagued by several companies of Captain Sidney Cook's Confederate guerillas. These bands of partisan rangers ransacked the countryside, taking from both Union and Confederate sympathizers since they were completely cut off from regular routes of supply. "Conditions became so deplorable (that) even returning Confederate soldiers often joined state and federal troops in running down these bandits". 34 In July 1864, Johnson County's militia was called into service to deal with the guerillas. A company of 101 men was detailed including, as Colonel Burgess Preston noted, "some I think are Rebel Sympathizers". 35 In his official report, Preston stated that "the gurillas Sidney Cook made a rade in Paintsville on the night of the 16 July with about fifty men and robed the storse and the Sheriff caled on me and ordered my Ridgment in and ... (we) started in pursuit of the thievs ... and marched within 7 miles of West Liberty and run him out...(and) took sevrl prisnrs. I had seventy five men with me." This company of the 65th

Kentucky State Militia included at least 17 ex-confederate soldiers, including Richard M., William A. C., and Aaron Wells. 37 Ironically, one of the guerillas in the raid on Paintsville was John Ficklin, who had been William Green Wells' commanding officer just 20 months earlier. 38

At his death in 1887, William Green Wells continued as an "unreconstructed" Democrat. Charles Jefferson Wells, the son of William, was born on Greasy Creek in Johnson County, on March 19, 1856.³⁹ Too young to serve in the Confederate Army, Charles remained in his father's household until July 16, 1877, when he married Margaret Jane Arrowood, the daughter of John J. Arrowood. John J. Arrowood, a native of North Carolina, served in the Confederate Army as a Private in Company G of the 69th North Carolina Infantry, ⁴¹ but at least one of his sons fought with the Union Army. The family moved to Kentucky in 1867. The author of this article is the great grandson of Charles Jefferson and Margaret Jane Arrowood Wells.

COVER STORY ON JEREMIAH AND MARGARET FAIRCHILD COUCH

Jeremiah Couch, Jr., son of Jeremiah and Aggie Gibson Couch, was born in Russell County, Va. on 13 April 1818. He died on 14 March 1884 in Russell County, Va. On 6 April 1836, Jeremiah married Margaret "Peggy" Fairchild, daughter of Aaron and Rebecca McSpadden Fairchild of Washington County, Va., born 28 May 1818 and died 9 Feb 1903.

Margaret had an older sister, Fanny Fairchild, born in 1816 that married John Couch, a brother to Jeremiah Couch, Jr.

Before 1850, Margaret and Fanny's parents, Aaron and Rebecca McSpadden Fairchild left Washington County, Va. and settled in Johnson County, Ky. Margaret and Fanny remained in Russell County, Va., where they raised large families.

Jeremiah and Margaret owned land in Reed's Valley in Russell County, Va. and sold out to Aaron Gose for a shotgun and a hound dog. Jeremiah later bought land at the flat woods and Stoney Creek in Wise County, Va. He later came back to Russell County, Va. with his family where they lived in a log house on the banks of the Clinch River. The house later burned and all that was saved

was a grandfather's clock and a round table, which is still in the possession of his grandson, Hezekiah Fairchild Couch today.

Jeremiah and Margaret are buried in the Charlie Gose Dickerson Cemetery in Reed's Valley of Russell County, Va.

Their children: Margaret "Peggy", b June 12, 1780, Rockbridge Co., Va., died March 30, 1863, near Bristol, Va., m Apr 6, 1797, Hugh C. Berry, b Oct 6, 1764, Augusta Co., Va., d near Bristol, Va., Dec 12, 1859, son of John and Jane (Campbell) Berry (branches of this family went to Texas, Mo. and Alabama); Thomas, b ca 1789, d in Ala or Ark ca 1859, m Elizabeth Walker (see notes below on this couples son); Jane m Matthew Brown; Moses m Jane Aiken; John m Elizabeth Apperson; and Rebecca (Mother of the lady on the cover of this issue) b ca 1794, m (1) Sept 22, 1812, Aaron Fairchild and settled in Johnson Co., Ky. Note: Thomas Kingsbury McSpadden, son of Thomas and Elizabeth (Walker) McSpadden above, b Jan 4, 1825, near Abingdon, Va., d at Tahleguah, Indian Territory (Present Okla) Dec 17, 1877, m in Ft. Payne, Ala, Elizabeth Jane Green, d at Chelsea, Okla., Sept 8, 1899, dau of James Sterling and Sarah (Hoyl) Green. Thomas Kingsbury enlisted in the 12th Regiment, Alabama Infantry, June 13, 1861. He was also a Methodist Missionary to the Cherokees in Georgia, and when the Cherokees of Ga and the Carolinas were moved to Indian Territory (Okla) in the "Trail of Tears", Thomas and his family moved west to Indian Territory to continue his missionary work. His son, John Thomas McSpadden, b Mar 15, 1852, Ft. Payne, Ala., d ca 1936, m at the Rogers Ranch, Cherokee Nation, Dec 15, 1885, Sallie Clementine Rogers, b Dec 16, 1863, Bonham, Texas, d Chelsa, Okla, Aug 25,1943, dau of Clement Vann and Mary (Schrinsher) Rogers, and the older sister of Will Rogers. The Rogers family of Georgia were moved in the "Trail of Tears". Many of you may recall Will Rogers used to say "Well my ancestors did/come on the Mayflower, they were here to meet them". During the period of the Civil War the Rogers took refuge in Texas from Marauding bands thus Sallie's birth in Texas. Sallie had 7 brothers and sisters, but Will was the only brother to reach adulthood. She was quite active in the Methodist Church and its activies in Sunday School and the Women's Missionary Society. Her husband, John died shortly after their 50th wedding anni versary and she remarried. There is quite an extensive write-up on Sallie in the CHRONICLES OF OKLAHOMA. Her Cherokee Ancestry is through both the Rogers and Vann families of Georgia. It has been my pleasure to do research in the Will Rogers Library at the Will Rogers Memorial, Claremore, Okla.



Part 1

Abraham Lemaster is the Progenitor of the Lemaster family of Eastern Kentucky based on the research of the late Howard Marshall Lemaster of Carlinsville, Illinois and Margaret Herberger of Peoria, Illinois, Co-Authors of the book, LEMASTERS USA 1639-1965. For further information on the first 3 generations listed herein you are referred to the extensive source information or logic which they list in stating their arrival at this lineage.

Only the basic lineage information to carry to the Eastern Kentucky group is used in this article.

Abraham Lemaster, probably born in France ca 1639, settled in the Western part of Maryland, later known as Charles County, Maryland. Based on transactions involving his property named "Betty's Delight" his wife was probably named Elizabeth, surname not known. Abraham died in Charles County December 6, 1722, based on the notations on the back of his September 20, 1722 will recorded in the Hall of Records, Annapolis, Md. Based on the sale of Betty's Delight, Elizabeth, wife of Abraham, died about 1727. Six children are noted by name in Abraham's will in which he designated his son John as his Executor.
