White's Run Christian Church Had First Beginnings In 1830

White's Run Christian Church, one of the older religious bodies in Carroll County was first

organized shortly before 1830 and the first church building was erected in that year on land given by William Spicer. Spicer, the donator of the church site was the grandfather of the late A.T. and E.V. Spicer.

Among the ministers who served the first church were the Revs. Kelley, Wagoner, Hawkins, Trout and Sherman. Other pastors included: D.T. Buck, Ernest Elliott, B.F. Cayto, J.B. Yager, Ray Montgomery, Rev. Ernest B. Motley, Rev. Alexander of Hodgenville; Rev. Vierling (who later went as a medical missionary to India), C.C. Omer of Hodgenville; W.E. Dance of Fort Myers, Fla, and Rev. R.C. Buck of Cincinnati. The present church building was erected in 1889 and the dedicatory sermon was preached by Rev. H. W. Elliott, who had his first pastorate with the White's Run church. Among the early members of the church were the families of Stafford, Spicer, Bledsoe, Davis, Tandy, Souther, Parrott, Gardner, Searcy, Shirley, Forsee, Darbro, O'Neal, Craig and Parkloe. Cci- 1960

Several members of this church have entered the ministry and have done good work in the Disciples of Christ, They include: Jasper and Flurry Stafford, E.V. Spicer and Russell Tandy.

Present membership is about 125 with a good Sunday School and a strong ladies Missionary society. Rev. Carl Allen is the present pastor.

Whites Run Christian church was built in the year 1830, the land upon which it was built being given by William Spicer, grandfather of A.T. and E.V. Spicer. Among the ministers who preached in this first church were the Revs. Kelley, Wagoner, Hawkins, Trout and Sherman.

In the year 1889 a new church was erected and the dedicatory sermon was preached by Bro. H.W. Elliott, who had his first pastorate with the Whites Run church.

Chief among the ministers who followed him down to the present time were D.T. Buck (deceased), Ernest Elliott (deceased), B.F. Cayto, of Madisonville; J.B. Yager, of LaGrange; Ray Montgomery, of Vincennes, Ind.; Ernest B. Motley, of Tesas; Rev. Alexander, of Hodgenville; Rev. Vierling (who later went as a medical missionary to India); C.C. Omer, of Hodgensville; W.E. Dance, of Ft. Meyers, Fla. Rev. R.C. Buck, of Cincinnati, is the present minister.

Among the members of the early church were the Staffords, Spicers, Davises, Bledsoes, Tandys, Southers, Parrotts, Gardners, Searcy, Shirleys, Forsees, Darbros, O'Neals, Craigs and Parkloes.

Misisters who have gone out from this church are Jesper and Flurry Stafford, E.V. Spicer and Russell Tandy.

Present membership is 125; Bible school enrollment, 70; while the Ladies' Aid and Missionary society is active factor in the church activities.
